#### Visit to Finchcocks Musical Museum

Wednesday 5th September 2007, 12.30pm for 2.00pm

Something different for this year - a visit with "Culture" thrown in! We have arranged to go a little further out and visit Finchcocks Musical Museum on Wednesday 5th September 2007. The collection comprises over 100 historical keyboard instruments, and a number of barrel organs, musical boxes and other mechanical devices.

The visit will include an introduction to the house, which dates from 1725, and a visit to the museum, followed by a musical recital. The subsidised cost will be £6 per person.

The house is situated on the A262 between Lamberhurst and Goudhurst, in Kent. It is not easy to get to by Public Transport but I will do my best to arrange lifts with other members for anyone who does not have their own transport.

I suggest we meet in the gardens for a picnic from 12.30pm to be ready for the visit starting at 2pm - we should be finished by 4pm. If the weather is not too good, the picnic can be eaten in the on site restaurant where drinks and cakes can also be purchased.

#### Visit to Eltham Palace

Wednesday 3rd October 2007, 11.15am for 11.30



The original palace was given to Edward II in 1305 and used as a royal residence from the 14th to the 16th century. Henry VIII spent much of his childhood there. From the time of the Civil War, the palace fell into neglect, until English Heritage restored it, together with the 1930s Art Deco mansion built by the Courtauld family next to the 15th century Great Hall.

19 acres of beautiful gardens surround the palace.

Members were very appreciative when last we visited, five years ago. We have arranged a guided tour, starting at 11.30, which will last about 90 minutes. Afterwards, we shall have access to the gardens.

Disabled visitors may park or be set down near the main entrance. The main car park is 200 yards away. Mottingham and Eltham stations are both within ten minutes' walk.

## An easy Guided Walk around Godstone

Meet in car park opposite White Hart: 10.30am on Thursday 27th September

This guided walk round the medie- ing neo-medieval almshouse cottages val centre of the ancient village of Godstone will be an easy stroll on paved paths, entirely on the flat, with frequent stops for our guide to tell us about the historic buildings and coaching inns on our route. The only part of the tour that takes us out of the historic centre of the village will be the 500 yards detour along the paved footpath past Bay Pond to the church, beside which are the charm-

and chapel designed by the great local the car park on the village green (by Victorian architect Gilbert Scott.

Our guide, Peter Fernée, was the manager of the Bay Pond Nature Reserve for 16 years and is the author of guide-books on the Godstone area as well as on London and the City. Now retired, he spends much of his time fund-raising for the Surrey Wildlife Fund, to which all proceeds of our walk (£2 each) will go.

There is no need to book. Meet in the pond, opposite the White Hart Inn) to commence the tour at 10.30am. The tour will end here at 12.30 - a convenient time for those who wish to lunch at one of the inns.

Godstone is a 10-minute bus ride from Caterham Station. Buses leave every half hour (the 409 at 25 past the hour; the 411 at 55 past the hour)

#### Walk alongside the Thames

Kingston to Richmond: Tuesday, 24th July 2007, 10.45am

This walk follows the Thames Path from Kingston to Richmond, and we shall see, among other things: Teddington Lock, Eel Pie Island, Marble Hill House, Ham House, Petersham Garden Centre and the site of Richmond Palace (where a number of English sovereigns died!). The walk is all on the level, but the surface is variable, including pebbled paths and areas which may be a little slippery if there has been recent rainfall, so do come with appropriate footwear. The total distance is about  $4\frac{1}{2}$  miles.

Meet: in Kingston Railway Station entrance hall at 10:45 am

Getting there: As the start and finish of the walk are in different places, use public transport. The walk is entirely within the London Travelcard area (Zones 2 - 6 will suffice if not travelling via Waterloo) / Freedom Pass area. Trains leave Waterloo Mainline and Clapham Junction Stations every 15 minutes and the journey time is about 30 minutes from Waterloo and 20 minutes from Clapham Junction.

There are toilets on Kingston Station.

The Walk: Will be in three easy stages, none of which should take more than an hour.
